Our Commitment to Lowering Risk

- ↓ Staff have been trained on social distancing and cleaning and supplied with task-specific personal protective equipment.
- ↓ Staff have been trained to offer campers fun games and activities in modified ways to reduce risk of exposure to viruses.
- ↓ Staff to camper ratios have been reduced to allow social distancing and permit staff to thoroughly clean between activities.
- ↓ Hand washing and sanitizer stations have been installed and are made available during frequent breaks.
- ↓ Staff can assist campers with sunscreen if needed while utilizing personal protective equipment to protect your camper. As a parent you can help with this effort by sending spray sunscreen.



Some Activities Were Too High Risk

To protect your child, we eliminated some camp activities based on CDC and SC DHEC guidance.

- ← No trips to water parks at this time
- ← No trips to playground or spray play area
- ← No off site journeys at this time for Adventure camp
- ← No overnights
- ← No cookouts

↳ ADVENTURE CAMP (10-12 year old) will meet at:

- ↳ James Island County Park at the Wappoo Shelter

How to Drop Off and Pick Up

Check In is 8:00 -8:30

Check Out is 4:30-5:30

- ▶ To reduce the risk of infection for all, please do not enter the facility when dropping off or picking up camper(s).
- ▶ All campers will be dropped off and picked up **outside** of facilities. Your location will use either:
 - ▶ *Curbside*. Staff will meet parents as they pull up in front of the facility to ensure the camper safely makes it out of the vehicle and into the building. Staff will bring a sign in/out sheet to you for your signature.
 - ▶ *Walk Up Table*. Parents will walk their kids to, but not in, the building and will sign in/out at a designated staffed table.



Pre-screening for Multiple Symptoms to Protect All Campers and Staff

Campers and staff must PASS all of the following criteria:

↳ Symptom check:

- ↳ Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19?
- ↳ Cough?
- ↳ Shortness of breath or difficult breathing?
- ↳ Fever?
- ↳ Chills?
- ↳ Muscle pain?
- ↳ Sore throat?
- ↳ New loss of taste or smell?

↳ Temperature Check

- ↳ Less than 100.4° F?

↳ Mark as PASS / FAIL on the department daily pre-screening log.

↳ Specific symptoms will never be recorded.

Social Distancing and Small Groups

- ▶ Campers will be placed in designated groups to limit the possibility of infection and promote social distancing. Each group will have a designated counselor/s for the entire week. We will try to honor requests to keep siblings and/or friends together in the same group but cannot guarantee it.
 - ▶ Groups will be identified by face mask color.
 - ▶ Your child will stay with the same group for their entire camp week. There will be little interaction between the different groups.
 - ▶ There will be little to no interaction with outside park patrons.
- ▶ It will be very challenging for the children within each individual group to maintain social distancing at all times. Please reinforce our efforts to educate them by having conversations with your child throughout the week about the importance of social distancing.

If a Child Begins to Show Symptoms During Camp

- ▶ The camper will immediately be taken to a designated isolation area.
- ▶ Parents will be immediately notified to pick their child up.
- ▶ While waiting for the pick-up, the child will not leave the quarantine area and a counselor will stay with the child to comfort and inform them. Both the symptomatic child and the staff member will wear a face mask.
- ▶ The child can return to camp with a doctor's note as long as the child is symptom free.
- ▶ If a child's physician recommends the child should be tested for COVID-19, parents should inform the camp director that they met the criteria for testing.

If a Child Begins to Show Symptoms During Camp

- ▶ Other parents of campers in the group will be informed there is a child that is being tested. Families will be notified of the results.
- ▶ If the sick child's test is positive, all campers in the group and counselor will quarantine for 14 days starting from the last day they had interaction with the sick child.
- ▶ The sick child can return to camp with a doctor's note stating that they are symptom free.
- ▶ All medical information is treated as confidential.

Camper Code of Conduct

The Charleston County Park & Recreation Commission is committed to providing campers with opportunities to learn by doing and experience personal success. We strive to promote self-confidence, decision-making and social skills, and environmental awareness in each camper. Our philosophy focuses on the need and growth of both the individual camper and the overall group. In order to maintain a positive and safe environment, our campers are expected to follow this code of conduct.
